PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Hunter Volleyball signed off on 2020 with a bang, and jumped headfirst into 2021 with the energy and enthusiasm of a committee seeing positive changes within volleyball throughout the community. Our 2021 Schedule was comprehensive, with traditional social competitions at Broadmeadow and Gateshead kicking off, new junior programs getting volleyballs in more kids' hands, and a reinvigorated representative program polished to make a splash in tournaments both at home and away. We had our eyes on coach and referee accreditation support to build regional expertise and a growing pool of interested members and supporting looking for new ways to participate.

An exciting Governance event occurred in May (yes, you heard me correctly)! Following a BBQ lunch prepared by our BBQ King Graeme, we hosted the inaugural Hunter Volleyball Inc Annual General Meeting. After the meeting we broke into small groups for a Member Workshop and brainstormed ideas and opportunities for the Association for 2022 and beyond. It was a great forum to bring community members together to gather new ideas, prioritise them and then incorporate into future planning and budgeting. We look forward to continuing this format in future years as we develop the strategies and identify priorities for realising our vision for Hunter Volleyball.



Momentum was developing, energies were high, engagement was increasing and efforts to create a broad regional footprint for volleyball were taking shape.

It was at this point that an unexpected honour was bestowed upon me, courtesy of the advocacy of the Hunter Volleyball Committee and Volleyball NSW. I was sitting at Newcastle Beach enjoying a setting sun, taking a breath during a busy week, and received a call from Volleyball NSW advising that they had nominated me for the 'Community Sport Administrator of the Year' award at the Sport NSW Champions of Sport celebration, and that I had been selected as a finalist. This alone was awkward and more than I was comfortable hearing. However, an invitation to attend the awards ceremony at BankWest Stadium Sydney in June followed, and among a room of equally deserving community sport administrators – many from Newcastle also - I was humbled to win this award. Leading our volleyball community and injecting enthusiasm for big dreams and a clear vision for a successful future has been my passion, taking reward every day in the smiles, friendships, and personal achievements of our members throughout the community whenever they gather to talk about, teach or play the game. Accolades are never the motivation, but this was deeply appreciated.

Once again COVID disrupted programming. The State and in particular our region were thrown into the spotlight during the latest phase of the pandemic. With all activities halted in August, the community rallied and continued to connect via online trivia, Rules of the Game quizzes, and socially distant outdoor activities at local parks and beaches until we could resume indoor sport at the end of October.

The Committee focused on "back of house" work, ensuring junior programming and representative programs were sustainable as we looked ahead to 2022, and continued the strategic conversations with venues in Maitland so that we can realise our goal of establishing a Participation Hub there by 2022, to meet the growing demand from players and parents alike. Negotiations continue.

Our Newcastle City hub indoor competitions resumed at the end of October, however we were unable to resume any activities at the Lake Macquarie hub at Hunter Sports HS. Junior programs and the representative program were halted midway, momentum was halted, and the spectre of “how far we’d come” hung over us as we headed into the Summer holidays with itchy feet and expectations of what could have been. The beach season beckoned and we got into our Halloween and Christmas tournaments, celebrating the fresh air, sunshine and reconnecting with each other. We hosted a Level 2 Referee Accreditation Course and looked to the future of officiating development. A shortened Spring indoor competition was run on Tuesday nights and a low-key season celebration was held at the Stadium featuring another hearty BBQ, courtesy of Graeme and Pat who worked in dire conditions!

Throughout 2021 we've seen so many members getting involved in new ways, and special thanks go to Ulrich Schall and Sasha Zajac for capturing imagery of our events and programs, and to Ross James who's developing an amazing portfolio of beach imagery capturing the energy and personalities involved in local beach activity! These still images capture the thousands of moments in time which make up our collective experiences of local volleyball, and remind us of 'that time, that point, that day' when we gathered and had fun through our shared interest.

On behalf of the Committee, I commend the 2021 Annual Report to you as a record of the year past. Details in the following report cover the financial period 1 January 2021 to 31 December 2021.

Opportunities ahead of us in 2022/23 continue to be the engagement with grants and funding providers, consolidating delivery plans for representative programs, engaging regional networks to build participation and competition opportunities outside of metropolitan Sydney, and fine-tuning our governance practices to ensure we expand with effective systems and engaged volunteers.

Personal thanks to the volunteer Hunter Volleyball Committee which met monthly throughout 2021 in person and virtually, continuing to strive for new horizons, our enthusiastic volunteer network including parents and coaches, giving so freely of their time to create opportunities for young and older alike; and once again, to you our valued members who make volleyball the success it is our region and our State.

SUMMER (FEBRUARY-MAY) FINALS 26/5/21




